Event Details

The Sustainability Learning Conference will take place on Thursday, 25th June at Blackburn Rovers. This event includes a special art competition for talented KS3/4 students, organised to highlight the importance of biodiversity and conservation.

Competition Overview

The Art Competition is open to all KS3/4 students who wish to showcase their artistic talents and understanding of the natural world. A cash prize will be given to the winning entry, and the competition will be sponsored and judged by a national organisation.

Entry Guidelines

- Participants will be required to research various habitats and species, using resources from the internet to inspire their artwork and deepen their knowledge of biodiversity and conservation. This can be done as a homework project or in school.
- This activity aims to encourage students to explore the distinctive features and biodiversity of different environments, including forests, jungles, grasslands, deserts, arctic regions, and oceans.
- Entrants need to create a piece of eco-focused art, choosing from a range of materials such as mixed media, acrylic paints, oil pastels, or collage techniques. This flexibility should allow the students to express their creativity and interpretation of their chosen habitat in a way that best suits their artistic vision.
- Prior to the event the students will need to develop a sketch to bring with them to the conference. (The required size of the artwork is to be either A3 or A2).
- Each student is required to bring the equipment and art materials necessary to complete their design. **They will have up to 2 hours to create a finished piece of work.**
- Each entry will be photographed and will appear on social media.
